Longtime Castleberry AD/Head Football Coach Honored at Memorial Service

In the spring of 1981 Castleberry ISD hired Trent Detamore as their new Head Football Coach and Athletic Director. He inherited a Castleberry football program that owned the longest number of consecutive years of losing seasons at that time in the state of Texas. It took just two years for that streak to end under Detamore's leadership as the Lions finished 6-4 in his second season as head coach.

His tenure at CHS was probably highlighted back in the mid to late 1980s when

the Lions started one season 8-0. In their ninth game of that season, they faced the Everman Bulldogs, who were also undefeated with an identical 8-0 record, in a district showdown for first place.

The Lions fought valiantly against an extremely talented Everman squad. Their team was made up of a number of future college football players most notable was Barron Wortham, who played for UTEP and later for the Dallas Cowboys.

The Lions fell 16-7 in a close game. The next week, minus five starters injured in the Everman game, lost to archrival Brewer and finished the season 8-2. This was back at a time when only the district champion advanced to the playoffs (not like now when the top four teams advance).

Coach Detamore eventually left CHS to become the head football coach for Christian Outreach International (COI). When he left, he was the longest tenured head football coach/athletic director in CHS history. A record that still stands to this day.

His tenure at COI would continue for the next 30+ years. (continued on page 3)

In this role he would recruit mostly junior college players from Christian universities (mostly in the mid-west) to play “American football” usually overseas against “club football” teams. During these trips, the COI squad would evangelize and witness to the communities where they were playing. Many of the early trips they made were to Eastern European countries including Ukraine. The fall of the Iron Curtain in 1989 opened up treks like this to previous Communist nations which would have been completely off limits for such mission trips. Detamore also led trips to Mexico and Australia. In 2012 he helped lead a local youth group from River Oaks United Methodist Church on a mission trip to Haiti to help rebuild after the catastrophic earthquake of 2010.

Thousands of young men have had their lives touched and changed by Trent Detamore. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma State University before being hired as an assistant coach at L.D. Bell High School.

Later he moved on to Northwest High School as the head football coach/AD. After four years at Northwest, Detamore took over the reins at Castleberry for the next 13 years, and of course spent the rest of his career at COI.

Even recently he was still leading COI groups on inner city mission trips in Orlando. It was a great shock when word spread to and through some of his former assistant coaches of his death.

About three years ago, his wife, Leslie (who had taught at Trinity High School for many years), was diagnosed with cancer. Since then, Detamore had spent almost his entire time with her as she battled the cancer.

In early January, after multiple brain surgeries and radiation treatments, Leslie was placed in hospice care. A few days later Detamore suffered a massive heart attack while working out at the gym. He died on Jan. 6; his wife Leslie passed the next day.

A lovely memorial service was held on Jan. 19 at the Historic Haltom Theater for Coach Detamore. Several hundred people came out to honor the legacy of Trent and Leslie and say their goodbyes. Castleberry was well represented by many former administrators, teachers, coaches, staff and many, many former players.

It was a beautiful service with praise worship songs opening the service. Many stories were shared about Trent and Leslie. Tears were shed, but even more laughs were heard and shared, which was more fitting and appropriate for a man whose life was to be celebrated.

A life full of great memories and thousands of lives forever touched and changed by this man of God, loved by so many. A man who will be missed but never forgotten. Farewell Coach Detamore.



Bessie Christine Kuhn Harding, 99, departed this life Sunday, Jan. 15, 2023. Funeral services will be held cryptside on Saturday, Jan. 28, 2023, in Greenwood Mausoleum.

Bessie was born Dec. 25, 1923, to James and Ella Kuhn in Three Sands, Okla. She graduated from Rodessa High School in Rodessa, La., in 1940. Her family moved to Bossier City, La., in 1941. She met her future husband, S/Sgt. Carrel L. Harding, while he was stationed at Barksdale AFB, La., before deployment to the EJO during WWII. When he returned from a three year tour, they were married Oct. 13, 1945. Their union was blessed with two loving daughters, Patty Jane and Linda Kay.

American Singer and Songwriter, Huddie “Leadbelly” Ledbetter

Many Texas musicians have become legendary figures for not only their great talents as musicians but also for their colorful lives.

Huddie Ledbetter, known to his fans as “Leadbelly,” was a pioneer blues musician starting in East Texas in the early 1900s, just as rhythm and blues was starting to develop its own musical identity. His own life was one of many tragedies, which he incorporated into his music. Ledbetter’s music would far outlast his 1949 death, influencing performers from country to rock for decades afterward.

Huddie William Ledbetter was born in a tiny Louisiana community just northwest of Shreveport. The family moved often, and within a couple of years moved across the state line into Bowie County. He showed a great love of music from an early age, but his music training was sporadic. His first musical gift was an accordion given to him by an uncle. He soon mastered it and picked up other instruments, such as the harmonica, fiddle, and what became his favorite, the 12-string guitar. By the time he was 15, Ledbetter was performing at clubs and parties across the area.

Around 1910, Ledbetter was living in Harrison County when he took to the road to pursue a music career, leaving behind his wife and two children. Though he became increasingly popular with his early blues sound, he often found himself in trouble with the law. Increasing issues with alcohol only compounded his problems. Some time in the late 1910s, he picked up the nickname “Leadbelly,” but its origins are uncertain.

It was also in the 1910s that he began singing one of his most popular songs, “*Good Night, Irene*.” He went on to write hundreds of songs, some gospel but mostly blues. “*Black Snake Moan*,” and “*Cotton Fields*” were among many songs he wrote and performed by the 1920s. Many of his songs were never recorded or were lost over time.

In 1915, he was jailed in Harrison County on an illegal gun charge but soon escaped. Three years later, he was imprisoned after another fight turned deadly. He was sentenced to 35 years. However, Gov. Pat Neff, who once promised not to pardon any prisoners, pardoned Ledbetter in 1925 after hearing him sing for his release. Ledbetter resumed his performances, but he still had legal problems. He was convicted in 1930 in Louisiana following a knife fight and another conviction in New York in 1939. His time in prison became an inspiration for many of his songs.

He promoted himself as the “King of the 12-String Guitar,” but he was only able to begin recording his songs in the 1930s.



John Lomax, co-founder of the Texas Folklore Society and a former administrator at the University of Texas, recorded dozens of Ledbetter’s songs through a Works Progress Administration program to record oral histories and folk music across the nation.

On a tour of the Northeast, Ledbetter found an appreciative circle of musicians in the growing folk music community. He would record several songs with Woody Guthrie.

In the early 1940s, he was a regular radio performer on a nationwide folk music program, hosted by John Lomax’s son, Alan. By 1949, Ledbetter had his own radio show in New York, Folk Songs of America. That year, just as his career and life were back on track, he was diagnosed with Lou Gehrig’s Disease, a degenerative neuromuscular disorder. The condition progressed rapidly, but he was able to perform one last concert, a memorial concert for John Lomax at the University of Texas that summer.

He died quietly in New York City in December 1949 at the age of 61. His life was one of hard luck and little respect save for fellow musicians and a handful of blues fans who saw brilliance in his performances.

As the years passed, fellow musicians kept his memory alive through his music. Within a few years, his influences became much more pronounced as rock and roll saw its introduction by the mid-1950s and blues reached a new level of artistry. In the 1950s, folk musician Pete Seeger wrote a book on playing guitar that praised Ledbetter’s technique. By the 1960s, a flood of popular musicians began recording Ledbetter’s songs. “*Good Night, Irene*” was a favorite of country stars such as Ernest Tubb and Willie Nelson. Tubb’s version topped the charts in 1950. Creedence Clearwater Revival made Ledbetter’s “*Midnight Special*” one of their most famous songs when they recorded it in 1969. It was also covered by Gene Autry, Johnny Cash, Nat King Cole, and the Grateful Dead. Ledbetter was inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1970.

In 1976, a movie was made about his life called simply, *Leadbelly*. In 1988, in the centennial year of his birth, he was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, honored as one of the early major influences.

The popular grunge-rock band Nirvana introduced Ledbetter to a new generation with Kurt Cobain’s rendition of “*Where Did You Sleep Last Night*” in a televised performance in 1994. Many of his surviving recordings from the 1940s from the Library of Congress and the Smithsonian Institution were released as albums in the 1990s.

so consider the pros and cons. It's also a good idea to know the roles you will play. For example, will you or your partner pay the day-to-day bills? It's important to be patient and diligent as the entire process may take several months. Remember to update all the appropriate forms, including a new Social Security card, driver's license, passport, bank accounts and credit cards, among other considerations. Additionally, notify your employer for payroll and health insurance coverage updates.
