Pre-K & Kindergarten Registration for 2024-2025 School Year Opens April 1

West Elementary will become the West Early Learners Academy and serve all WSISD pre-kindergarten and kindergarten students beginning with the 2024-25 school year. The school will provide our youngest learners with a solid foundation in early literacy and math and visually stimulate learning for our students.

The West Early Learners Academy will give every child the opportunity to explore scenes and places beyond the school walls and White Settlement ISD community. The walls and ceilings will pop with scenery like mountains, waterfalls, forests and animals throughout the world. The school will offer a city system that includes a bank, store, hospital, restaurant and much more.

Pre-K Registration

Pre-Kindergarten students must be 4 years old on or before Sept. 1, 2024. The Early Childhood Academy at West Elementary

serves all WSISD pre-kindergarten and Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) students as well as the First Class Learning Center (day care for employees' children).

Pre-kindergarten enables young learners to develop foundational academic and social skills that will help them to be more successful in kindergarten and beyond. The Early Childhood Academy provides a full-day, pre-kindergarten program, to prepare students for kindergarten and help them excel academically.

WSISD's Early Childhood program provides developmentally appropriate curriculum that supports the needs of the whole child in a safe, accessible environment that respects and supports diversity. Research-based, early childhood best practices provide students with a setting that meets their individual needs and creates family partnerships.

Bear Soccer Boys are District Champions!

The Brewer Bears boy's soccer team wrapped up the regular season with a 4-1 victory over Azle last Tuesday.

Jonathan Cortez scored two goals for the Bears in the Azle game, and Guadalupe Diaz and Alexis Vega added a goal a piece.

Brewer wrapped up the regular season with an 8-2-2 district record and opened the playoffs on Monday against Everman after the paper had already gone to press.

The Bears won their second consecutive district championship with the win over Azle.

On the girl's side, Brewer wrapped up the regular season with a 1-1 draw against Azle, but ended up winning the game in a 4-2 shoot out.

On the diamond, the Brewer baseball team came up a little short against Aledo last week, losing to the Bearcats by a score of 4-1 and 1-0 on Tuesday and Friday respectively.

Coach Gilbert Ramirez said that this team did compete well in the series against Aledo, particularly in two phases of the game.

“I thought we pitched really well and played great defense in the series against Aledo,” Ramirez said.

In game one, Trey Ramirez (5 IP, 5 H, 3 R, 4K) and Ricardo Olmos, (1.2 IP, 0 H) both threw well for Brewer, and in game two, Jayden Ayala-Hinojosa (6.2 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 4K) had a strong outing for the Bears.

Offensively, Evan Laredo led the way at the plate, going 3-6 (.500) with a triple and RBI in the series versus Aledo.

The Bears followed that up with a 10-0 victory over FW Northside on Saturday and Ramirez said it was another good day on the bump for his team.

“Jesse Orozco and Ricardo Olmos threw a combined no hitter,” Ramirez said.

In softball, Brewer lost to Aledo by a score of 15-1 last Tuesday.

Eligibility Requirements

Children must meet [eligibility requirements](#) in 1 or more of the following areas:

1. Child is eligible for free or reduced price lunch program. The income of every individual who lives in the house is calculated. Two recent proofs of income must be provided for every working individual in the household (see documents below). [Click here for 2023-24 income guidelines](#).
2. Child has Limited English Proficiency. (Language test will be given to student at registration.)
3. Child is homeless (as determined by WSISD Student Residency Questionnaire).
4. Student is the child of an active duty member of the United States Armed Forces, including one who was killed or injured while serving on active duty (documentation required).
5. Child is or has been under conservatorship of the Department of Family and Protective Services (foster care) (CPS/court documentation required).
6. Child’s parent is eligible for the Star of Texas Award (documentation required).

Registration will not be finalized until the following documents are submitted and verified:

- Valid Parent/Guardian Photo ID (ex. driver's license)
- Certified Birth Certificate (To order a certified birth certificate, visit [Texas.gov](#).)
- Student's Immunization Record
- Student's Social Security Card
- Proof of Residency (address) in form of a current lease or water, electric or gas bill in parent/guardian name (within 30 days).

If qualifying based on income, proof of income in the form of two current paycheck stubs; current pay envelopes; letter from employer stating gross wages paid and how often paid; unemployment, workers' compensation or disability payment stub; or TANF, AFDC, or food stamp case number must be provided at registration for every working individual in the household. (Self-employed individuals may provide their 2022 income tax return or business or farming documents such as ledger books or self-issued paycheck stub.)

Pre-Kindergarten Registration Steps

1. Gather the required documents.
 2. Complete online registration below.
 3. Parents who anticipate that their child may qualify due to limited English will need to bring their child to registration for language testing. Parents may want to bring documentation that helps their child qualify through other means (such as income) in case their child does not qualify by language due to language test scores.
- Pre-kindergarten registration will not be finalized until documents are submitted and verified.

Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten students must be 5 years old on or before Sept. 1, 2024. WSISD offers kindergarten at Blue Haze, Liberty and West Elementary Schools, the North Elementary STEAM Academy and the Virtual Academy of North Texas (limited space is available at the [Fine Arts Academy](#)). WSISD provides a full-day program that enhances the social and cognitive development of our early learners and equips them with the foundations for learning.

Dual Language Kindergarten is offered at Liberty Elementary and the North Elementary STEAM Academy.

This is only kindergarten registration for children not currently enrolled in a WSISD pre-school program.

Current WSISD pre-school students (in a pre-kindergarten or ECSE program) will not attend registration. These students will receive assessments during the school day.

Families with children currently in pre-K or ECSI will not complete new student registration. All current pre-k parents will complete online returning student verification this spring.

Registration will not be finalized until the following documents are submitted and verified:

- Valid Parent/Guardian Photo ID (ex. Driver's License)
- Certified Birth Certificate (To order a certified birth certificate, visit [Texas.gov](#).)
- Student's Immunization Record
 - Student's Social Security Card
 - Proof of Residency (address) in form of a current lease or water, electric or gas bill in parent/guardian name (within 30 days).

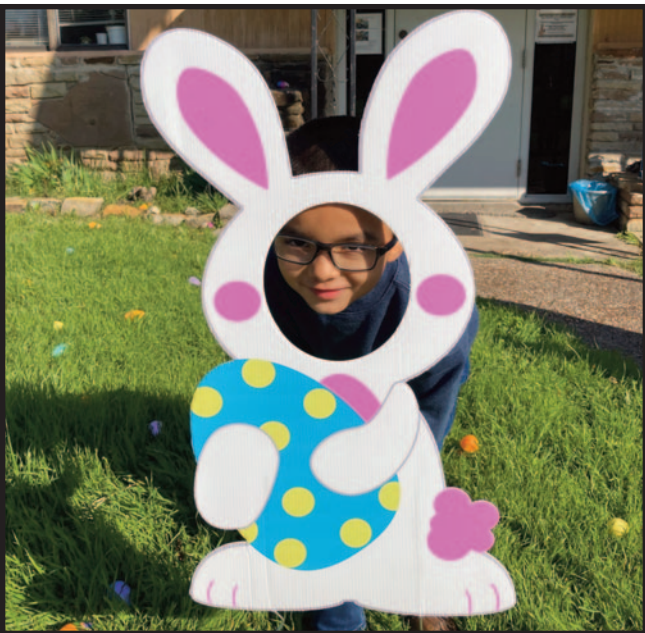
Historical Museum Hosts Easter Egg Hunt

- Keep all new lithium coin batteries in a secure compartment, up high and out of children's reach. Remove expired batteries from devices, and place them away safely out of reach of children until you can recycle them properly.

- Power your devices with batteries that have child safety features. When it comes to lithium coin batteries, Duracell is the only brand on the market to offer a non-toxic bitter coating that helps discourage children from accidentally swallowing them. 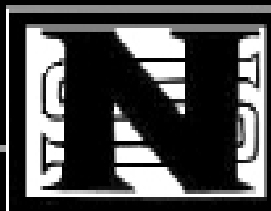
