## Brewer Football Wrap Up

The Brewer football team wrapped up the regular season last Thursday with a loss to the number three team in the state, and coach Jason Wheeler said in spite of the defeat, there are a lot of reasons to be optimistic about next season.

The Bears lost to Aledo by a score of 47-6 in their season finale, and Wheeler said it was pretty tough sledding.

“They're really good at what they do,” Wheeler said. “There were times we showed some good things offensively and defensively. Mehki Elmore, with the way he has come on here lately, gives us a lot of hope for the future. There were some positive things and some things that were inconsistent, and that's kind of been the name of the game this year with a young team. That's one of the things we look forward to improving next year.”

Next season is shaping up well for Brewer football, with 15 starters (seven offense, eight defense) returning and some promising talent moving up from the JV and freshman squads.

“There are some kids that we think may be able to help us in the immediate future to fill in some holes,” Wheeler said. “And then we have a few kids coming up that could be competing for spots of kids already playing at the varsity level. So for me, as long as the guys on the offensive

line are there and continue to improve, and we are able to create some more depth on the offensive line, I think we get much better. As far as the defense is concerned, we have a lot of guys coming back there as well.”

The Bears finished 2-8 overall this season, and Wheeler said that while it was not the record he would have hoped for, there are some good signs for the years to come.

“The biggest thing for me is that everybody knew about these last three games (Burleson Centennial, Denton Ryan and Aledo) and what kind of challenge they were going to be,” Wheeler said. “And the kids, regardless of the situation, just continued to play and try to get better. Sometimes it just comes down to execution and experience.”

With the aforementioned schools along with Justin Northwest, district 3-5A featured four of the top 30 teams in the state (Max Preps) this season.

Wheeler said he is actually happy about that fact.

“From my point of view, I want the kids to understand that it's a good thing,” Wheeler said. “Because you get the opportunity to take that challenge on and see how you can perform.”

## Bulk Trash Pick-Up Begins Nov. 14

White Settlement residents may begin to set items out for bulk trash pick up on the Friday before the second full week of the month.

Residents should make sure the trash pile follows the guidelines so that it will be picked up:

- Make sure your items are placed clear of low-hanging limbs and wires, mailboxes, parked cars, or other obstructions.

- The total size of pile/area allowed is 10 cubic yards (8 feet long by 6 feet wide by 6 feet tall) or roughly the size of a Volkswagen Beetle.

- No items generated from other locations, hazardous materials, tires, electronics, appliances with coolant or gas.

The pile must be placed at an address with an active water account to be picked up and bulk piles are picked up by a truck utilizing a hydraulic claw.

# Olympic Medalist, Texan Babe Didrickson Zaharias *by Dr. Ken Bridges*

**Babe Didrickson Zaharias** succeeded at nearly every sport she tried. The Texas native was a gifted athlete, becoming an Olympic medalist, champion golfer, and a celebrity along the way. She paved the way forward for women as professional athletes and became an inspiration for millions.

Mildred Ella Didrickson, affectionately known as “Babe,” was born in Port Arthur in 1911. She was the sixth of seven children in an active family. Her father was a carpenter and a seaman while her mother was a gifted athlete herself, known for her skills as an ice skater. Didrickson’s parents and three eldest siblings had immigrated from Norway just a few years before.

As a young child, the family moved to Beaumont. She reportedly picked up the nickname “Babe” among her friends for how well she played baseball against other neighborhood kids, but it was also a nickname her mother had given her. At a young age, she showed tremendous athletic abilities in many different sports. In high school, she was an All-American basketball player and a track and field star.

She dropped out of high school her senior year to take a job with the Employers Casualty Insurance Company in Dallas, mostly to organize its semi-pro women’s basketball team, a team that won the Amateur Athletic Union national championship for 1931.

Didrickson qualified for the 1932 Olympics in Los Angeles. Competing against the best athletes in the world, she won three medals. She won gold medals for the javelin and the 80 meter hurdles. She took the silver medal for the women’s high jump.

After her success in the Olympics, she was a nationwide celebrity. She spent the next couple of years touring with a women’s exhibition basketball team. In 1934, she played in three exhibition baseball games, pitching for the Philadelphia Athletics, St. Louis Cardinals, and the minor-league New Orleans Pelicans. She was one of the first known women to play for a Major League Baseball team (a couple had played for minor league teams and semi-pro teams previously), even if for a spring training game. She still holds a women’s baseball throwing record.

She took up golf in 1935. She worked hard to master the game and competed in the Los Angeles Open, a professional golf event, in 1938. She was the only woman to compete in the event until the 1990s. Here, she met her future husband, George Zaharias, who was a

professional wrestler and sports promoter.

With golf, the best women players were all amateurs, so to regain her amateur status, the United States Golf Association told her she could not play any other sport for three years. Doing so, she regained her amateur status in 1942. The PGA Tour allowed her to play in several events in 1945 as an amateur in a season that saw many of its best players still fighting World War II, which was common for many sports. She played in three tournaments, making the cut for the final rounds for two events. She is still the only woman to make the cut and place in a PGA tournament.

She won the 1946 U. S. Women’s Amateur and the 1947 British Ladies Amateur. She attempted to qualify for the U. S. Open in 1948, but golf officials turned down her request, stating that the tournament was for men only. In 1949, she bought her own golf course outside of Tampa, Florida, living nearby for some time.

Frustrated with the limited opportunities for women athletes at the time, she co-founded the Ladies Professional Golf Association in 1950, and the same year, she won all three major championships for women. She would go on to win 41 LPGA tournaments between 1950 and 1956. She won the U. S. Women’s Open three times between 1950 and 1954. In 1953, she founded the Babe Zaharias Open in Beaumont, which became a regular LPGA event through the 1960s. Naturally, she won the first tournament.

She was popular with the press and the public alike. In 1950, the Associated Press named her as the best woman athlete of the first half of the twentieth century. In 1952, she had a cameo appearance in the Spencer Tracy and Katherine Hepburn comedy *Pat and Mike*.

In 1953, she was diagnosed with colon cancer, but she determined to survive and continue her athletic career. She had extensive surgery in 1954, and one month later, won the U. S. Women’s Open. She became an outspoken advocate for cancer awareness and research through the American Cancer Society. Cancer, unfortunately, was still very difficult to treat in the 1950s. The cancer returned, and she was not able to recover. She died in a Galveston hospital in September 1956 at the age of 45.

Years after her passing, she was still fondly remembered. In Beaumont, a public park was later named in her honor, and a museum dedicated to her life was opened. In 1974, the City of Tampa bought her golf course, now neglected and in disrepair, but rebuilt and reopened it as a public course renamed in her honor, one still operating today.

The post office issues a stamp in her honor in 1981. She was one of the first inductees into the Women’s Golf Hall of Fame in 1977 and named the Woman Athlete of the Century by the Associated Press in 1999.

- Congress passed a resolution in 1926 for an annual observance, and Nov. 11 became a national holiday beginning in 1938.

- In 1954, President Dwight D. Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day.
- Every Veterans Day and Memorial Day, Arlington National Cemetery holds an annual memorial service. The cemetery is home to the graves of over 400,000 people, most of whom served in the military.

## County Clerk Now Offers Remote Marriage Licenses

Getting a marriage license no longer requires a trip to the Tarrant County Clerk's Office.

The program is available to everyone but could be especially attractive to members of the military who will no longer be required to schedule a trip home.

"We are the first certified in the State of Texas to offer remote marriage licenses," said County Clerk Mary Louise Nicholson. "We are looking to serve military service men and women and those people who do not want to make the drive to get their marriage licenses. You don't have to ask for leave. You can be in the comfort of your home or at your military base."

Remote marriage licenses became legal when the Texas Legislature approved **SB 907**.

To use the service, couples must have access to computer or laptop that includes a webcam and speakers to conduct a virtual meeting.

# Quick Repair Projects to Prep Your Home for Winter

It's fall, which means it's time to roll up your sleeves, make minor fixes and prepare your home before it's time to hunker down for winter. Here are four easy DIY projects that will ensure your humble abode is in tip-top shape before the cold weather arrives.



## Patch It Up

If you experienced storms this past season, survey your home's exterior for any damage. Take a walk around the grounds and look at the siding and the condition of the roof, including the garage and porch.

Use waterproof tape to temporarily patch small holes in vinyl siding, loose shingles or leaks in your gutter. The tape is formulated to withstand extreme temperatures, so it can be used for any indoor or outdoor job that requires a waterproof seal.

Making quick repairs will save you from expensive water damage costs down the road and help prevent any further issues arising during the cold weather season.

## Lawn Improvement

As the leaves fall off the trees and onto the ground, an alternative to raking is to pull out the lawn mower.

Trim the leaves into smaller pieces, which can then be used as natural mulch around the yard and garden. Layer the compost around perennial beds or other plants to provide insulation and protection through the winter.

Mid-to-late fall, with the warm soil and cool air, is also an ideal time for planting grass seed, and fertilizing and filling in holes with the leaf compost. This will put you on a path to a greener lawn next spring.

## Prepare the Deck

Before the first cold front approaches, make sure to clean up the patio or deck and store outdoor umbrellas, cushions and rugs in a safe spot in the garage or shed. If you notice any rot or wetness on the deck, it can be a simple fix by replacing the wood boards or using a wood filler to prevent further damage.

Winterize large patio furniture and protect items that are staying outside with a weatherproof cover. To keep the covers in place, secure them to the bottom of the furniture.

## Squeaky Clean Exterior

Once the patio is prepped, turn your attention to the rest of the exterior. Debris and stains collected on the outside of the house during summer can set over the winter, so it's a good idea to power wash away the dirt.

Start with the driveway, deck and windows and then take time to wash the siding and gutters, as long as you spray water in a direction that won't force it behind the siding or under shingles. This project will help remove lingering grime, mold and mildew and ensure the outside area is clean and ready for winter.

After checking off these projects on your fall list, your home will be properly prepped so you can relax, slow down and enjoy the season.

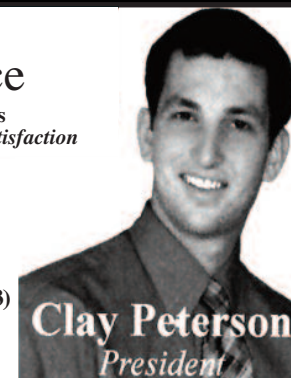
