Brewer Golf Team Takes Second Place at Texan Shootout

Big plays cost the Brewer football team on Friday night as they lost to Azle by a score of 42-21 to move to 0-2 in district competition.

Coach Jason Wheeler said while there were some bright spots in the game for the Bears, they have to shore up a few things defensively heading into this week's game against Denton.

"We gave up too many big plays," Wheeler said. "I think they earned the first one, but then they burned us on a couple of big runs in the first half and had a couple of short fields. They scored 28 and we had 14. We did a good job of moving the football and controlling the clock, which is what we needed to do. But we just allowed too many big plays."

Wheeler said he did have some standout performances in the game, and said when it comes to Brewer's ground game, he could not ask for much more from his team.

"Our running backs, Kam Coleman and Jordan Houston did a great job of running the ball," Wheeler said. "I keep talking about these guys, but the offensive line does a great job. We've run the ball really well this year, so I have to give a shout out to those guys because they make it happen."

evening, and Wheeler said his team will need to expect another tough contest.

"I don't know a whole lot about them," Wheeler said. "We have never played them, but I think any game we go into is going to be competitive and we are just going to have to be ready to go. Otherwise, we will find ourselves in the same situation we were in on Friday night."

On the court, Brewer lost to Saginaw 3-2 last Tuesday, and had it's bye on Friday.

Coach Jill Barkey said she saw some promising signs from her team in the Saginaw game and said her team focused on fundamentals.

"Our game against Saginaw, while incredibly competitive, obviously didn't go the way we wanted," Barkey said. "We spent the rest of this week continuing to work on our game both mentally and for skill."

Brewer wraps up the first half of district this week, and Barkey said she would like to see her team play a more complete game.

"To finish out district we need to really be able to push to finish," Barkey said. "We need to come out aggressive and not wait to get going. It's been taking us too long into a match to get settled in."

Brewer plays at Granbury at 6 p.m. tomorrow evening, and Barkey said she expects a good game.

"Granbury will be tough," Barkey said. "But I know if we get our heads in the right spot and come out strong we can come out on top."

2025 Texas Fish Art Contest Opens for Entries

The Texas Freshwater Fisheries Center (TFFC) has opened the Texas division of Wildlife Forever's 2025 Fish Art Contest for entries.

The Fish Art Contest, accepting entries until Feb. 28, is part of an international conservation education program designed to foster youth interest in fish, fisheries and fishing.

"The Fish Art Contest does a tremendous job of exposing students across Texas to the wonders of fish and fisheries resources through the nexus of art," said Tom Lang, TFFC director. "We always look forward to this time of year when we are once again amazed by the outstanding work and artistic interpretations of these young Texans."

Participants must submit a completed entry form and an original illustration of a wild fish found in Texas. Applicants in fourth through 12th are also required to submit a one-page creative writing piece. Once the entrance form is submitted, applicants must mail their artwork to TFFC, 5550 FM 2495, Athens, TX, 75752. The physical artwork must have a landscape orientation between 8x10 inches and 9x12 inches and be

postmarked no later than Feb. 28.

The Texas Fish Art Contest's new category this year is the Special Species Award, which will showcase a focused species or set of species each year. One winner will be chosen from all entries and spotlighted at the TFFC. Students must correctly label their artwork and be identifiable as the correct focus species, but do not need to submit additional paperwork for consideration.

For the 2024-2025 contest year, the focus species is the Guadalupe Bass, the state fish of Texas.

This year's award honors Shirley Watson and her third-grade class at Decatur Elementary School, which, in 1989, realized Texas had no official state fish. They traveled to Austin and testified in front of lawmakers about why a fish found "only in Texas" was the right fish for the job and their efforts paid off. Find out more about the state fish and how the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) is working to restore this Texas icon to its native range.

Texas winners are recognized in the Texas Fish Art calendar, win scholarships, are featured in TPWD's Fish Art Contest Flickr album and invited to a family fishing celebration to recognize their achievements.

Additionally, winners will earn automatic entry to Wildlife Forever's national contest. Texas students may choose to enter national specialty awards with fish not found in Texas, however, they will not be eligible for Texas state awards due to the one entry per student limit.

"We have a unique opportunity to celebrate the talents of our Texas

students, and the beauty of our diverse fish found in Texas," said Kate Barkalow, Education and Interpretation Coordinator at TFFC. "In doing so, we also recognize the amazing efforts of our teachers and biologists who support them. To complete their piece of art, students research their fish, its habitat and conservation efforts being made to protect the species, forging a connection between the student and fish."

Educators who wish to have their students enter the 2025 contest can find entry forms, rules, guidelines and more online. A lesson plan offers interdisciplinary curriculum including lessons and activities, a species identification section profiling each state fish, a glossary and student worksheets.

The Fish Art Contest is sponsored by Wildlife Forever, Bass Pro Shops, Rapala, U.S. Forest Service, Wonders of Wildlife, Guy Harvey Ocean Foundation, National Fish Habitat Partnership, U.S. Department of the Interior Bureau of Land Management, Association of Fish and Wildlife Agencies, Adventure Keen, International Game and Fish Association, REPYOURWATER and Western Native Trout Initiative.

Located in White Bear Lake, Minn., Wildlife Forever is a nonprofit multispecies conservation organization dedicated to conserving America's wildlife heritage. Working at the grassroots level, Wildlife Forever has funded conservation projects in all 50 states, committing millions of dollars to "on-the-ground" efforts. Wildlife Forever supports habitat restoration and enhancement, land acquisition, research and management of fish and wildlife populations.

Texas History Minute, by Dr. Ken Bridges

Fort Worth Legend, Amon G. Carter



Amon G. Carter was another of the larger-than-life figures that dominated Texas business in the early 20th century. His efforts cemented Fort Worth's attempts to become a major industrial and cultural center for the Southwest.

Carter was born in 1879 near the small town of Crafton in Wise County. He quit school at the age of 11 to help support the family.

In 1905, he settled in Fort Worth where he soon found work as the advertising manager of the new *Fort Worth Star* newspaper. However, the newspaper quickly faltered. To save the paper, Carter in 1908 led an effort to raise money to buy the competing *Fort Worth Telegram*. On New Years Day 1909, he combined the two papers into the *Fort Worth Star-Telegram* that became one of the dominant papers of West Texas.

He quickly developed a reputation as a civic promoter and eventually made Fort Worth's slogan "*Where the West Begins*" popular. In 1911, he arranged for the first airplane flight in city history, which began a long relationship between Carter and aviation.

By the late 1920s, he was part owner of what became American Airlines and convinced other shareholders to move its headquarters to Fort Worth. In 1922, he opened

the city's first radio station, WBAP, which for many years shared a frequency with Dallas station WFAA. He also convinced the state to open Texas Tech University in Lubbock in 1923.

In the late 1930s, he convinced what became General Dynamics to open a plant in the city and later attracted Bell Aviation to the area.

In the meantime, he bought land and invested heavily in oil exploration. Though Carter never held an elected office, he effectively served as an ambassador for Fort Worth's business and cultural interests, becoming one of the most powerful figures in the city.

From the 1930s through the 1950s, he nurtured a strong rivalry with Dallas. One story relayed for years was that he had such a dislike for Dallas that he would always bring a sack lunch to any meetings he had in Dallas rather than spend money in the city. Part of this was seen with the fight with Dallas over airports. Carter had supported the creation of Greater Southwest International Airport in the early 1950s, not far from the modern Dallas-Fort Worth International Airport while Dallas continued to support its own Love Field.

In 1945, he established the Amon G. Carter Foundation to fund cultural and education projects across the state. The foundation has helped fund museums, symphonies, and art projects for decades. It has also established scholarships and provided financing for medical research.

After World War II, he expanded his media holdings into television. In 1948, WBAP became the first television station in the South (its call letters changed to KXAS in the 1970s). But after the war, Carter slowed down. His health declined and suffered the first of several heart attacks in 1953. He died at the age of 76 in 1955.

His tireless work for Texas was honored in many ways after his passing. Amon G. Carter Lake in Montague County, constructed in 1956, was named in his memory. In 1961, his daughter, Ruth Stevenson, opened the Amon Carter Museum of Amer-

ican Art in Fort Worth, one of the most respected art museums in the state.

At Carter's request, much of his western art collection was included. The Carter BloodCare Center was founded through donations from the Carter Foundation in 1959 and is one of the largest in Texas, including locations in Bedford and Waco. Amon Carter Riverside High School in Fort Worth is also named in his honor. Buildings at Texas Tech, Texas A&M University, and Texas Christian University are also named after him.

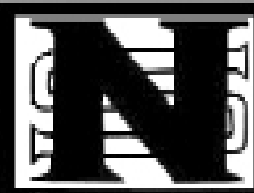
