## Brewer Football: Bears to Face Hornets at Homecoming Game Tomorrow!

The Brewer football team came up short against Richland on Friday night, but made some healthy progress offensively that should create confidence for tomorrow night's game against Azle.

The Bears lost to Richland by a score of 58-31, and coach Jason Wheeler said it was really a tale of two halves.

"The first half was no bueno," Wheeler said. "The second half we came out and executed. We got three straight stops and scored on five straight possessions, but it wasn't enough to overcome what had happened by half time. We need to put together four quarters. Last week, we had several injuries against Aledo, so we had some new faces out there...the kids that were out there fixed things in the second half, but it was kind of fast for them early on."

Lucas Davis passed for 197 yards and three touchdowns, while Kameron Coleman rushed for 219 yards and two touchdowns.

Devan Roberts finished the game with 106 yards receiving and two touchdowns.

Wheeler said he was pleased with the offensive production.

"We ran the ball well," Wheeler said. "We were able to do some play action on first and second down and create some positive situations for us on third down. I really enjoyed that, and not just the fact that the offense came alive, but to see those younger kids that are contributing really step up and capitalize on some thing."

Brewer will host Azle at 7 p.m. tomorrow night, and Wheeler said he expects a

good match up.

"It's a rivalry game," Wheeler said. "So for our kids, it's just keeping level-headed and focusing on the task in front of them. Azle is 3-0 coming in, so they are going to feel good about themselves, but I don't think there is any reason we shouldn't have a great week of preparation and have some confidence going into the game as well. It's just a matter of execution."

On the court, the Lady Bears lost to Azle last Friday and coach Jill Barkey said it was a tough loss.

"Honestly, we are disappointed," Barkey said. "Our offense was not able to run the way we wanted it to and our defense struggled against their fast offense."

Brewer is in its bye this Friday, and Barkey said she has two objectives for the week.

"We have to focus on our serve/receive and running our offense," Barkey said.

# Texas Celebrates National Hunting and Fishing Day Sept. 28



The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) asks Texans to invite their friends and family into the outdoors to celebrate National Hunting and Fishing Day (NHF) on Sept. 28.

This annual holiday, celebrated on the fourth Saturday of September, recognizes hunters and anglers for their contributions to wildlife and conservation.

Hunters and anglers primarily fund the state's wildlife management programs through the purchase of hunting and fishing licenses, stamps and endorsements, as well as through taxes paid on hunting and fishing equipment, motorboat fuel, firearms and ammunition. License purchases generate millions of dollars for conservation programs that benefit both game and non-game

species statewide. According to a 2022 study, the total economic impact in Texas amounted to a combined \$27.6 billion for hunting, fishing and sport shooting activities.

"The significant contribution made by Texas' outdoors women and men toward research and species management is one of the reasons why the tradition of hunting and fishing in Texas has endured for generations," said TPWD Executive Director David Yoskowitz. "Without the help of Texas' hunters, anglers, and landowners, biologists would not be able to complete critical projects aimed at preserving and maintaining the state's natural spaces and wildlife population. This year, in honor of National Hunting and Fishing Day, I invite all Texans to take a hunter education course, attend a neighborhood fishing event and learn how participating in these activities aids in conserving the environment and our native species."

For many years, the proportion of people who hunt and fish in Texas has lagged behind huge increases in state population. While Texas experienced a pandemic-influenced surge in outdoor recreation, it hasn't created a significant long-term increase in the total number of people participating in hunting and fishing, which could spell problems for natural resource conservation in the future. Conservation is mostly funded by these participants.

In 2021, TPWD launched the Texas Re-

cruitment, Retention and Reactivation (R3) Strategic Plan to connect more Texans to outdoor recreation and carry forward these time-honored traditions to future generations. Continued participation in fishing, boating, hunting and shooting sports helps fund efforts such as fish stocking, access and habitat improvements, and mentored hunting programs, which introduce new hunters to the sport in a safe environment.

In addition to conservation, TPWD endeavors to foster lifelong participants in hunting, fishing, boating, and shooting sports, and create a better-informed public with more interest in conserving wild things and wild places in Texas and beyond.

To learn about hunting, take an online or in-person hunter education course. Hunter education certification is required for anyone born on or after Sept. 2, 1971 and equips them with the necessary tools and information they need to be safe in the field: basics about firearm safety, species identification, zones of fire and more.

TPWD also offers mentored hunting workshops to introduce new hunters to the experience and teach needed skills. The Hunting for Beginners webpage also offers a wealth of information.

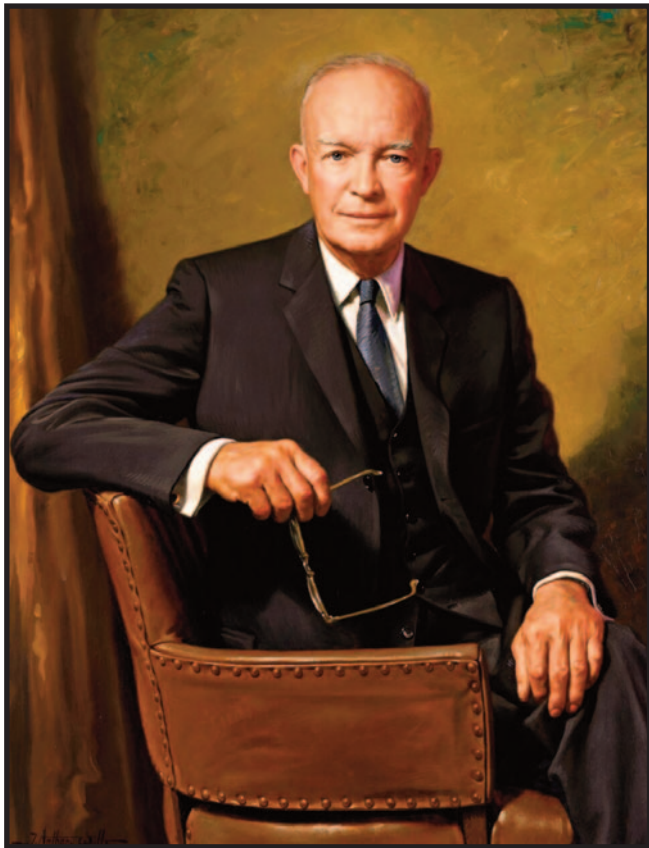
Texans who want to learn to fish can also find many resources on the TPWD Fishing for Beginners webpage: how to get started, safety, basic gear assembly, tackle boxes and supplies, bait and lures, how to cast and more.

Individuals interested in becoming a volunteer fishing instructor can visit the TPWD angler education instructor website. Fishing events around the state are listed on the online event page and no license is required to fish from the shore or dock at a Texas State Park.

Congress launched NHF Day in 1971 to recognize hunters and anglers for their leadership in wildlife and conservation. In 1972, Richard Nixon signed the first presidential proclamation to hold it on the fourth Saturday in September every year to celebrate the rich tradition of hunting, target shooting and fishing.

# 34th U.S. President and Army General, Dwight D. Eisenhower



grandfather had been a preacher, and his father insisted on daily prayers and Bible readings. His mother, Ida, was a devout and determined woman whose family had escaped the violence of Civil War Virginia and became a pacifist as a result. She had even attended college, where she met her future husband.

Though he became beloved by the nation as “Ike,” Eisenhower was one of several “Ikes” growing up. His oldest brother, Edgar, was called “Big Ike,” while the future president was simply “Little Ike.” Though his mother discouraged the use of nicknames, the “Ike” moniker stuck with him the rest of his life.

After the hard years in Denison, the Eisenhowers moved to Abilene, Kansas, in 1892. Eisenhower’s father picked up work as a mechanic at a creamery, and their fortunes steadily improved.

As a child, Eisenhower was adventurous and athletic, exploring the outdoors and playing sports. He was very competitive with his older brothers, and his mother had once called him her “most troublesome boy.” Interestingly enough, his mother had taught him to cook, which he took to enthusiastically. A younger brother died at the age of four, but the family pushed on, relying on their faith to endure hard times. In fact, the Eisenhowers held Bible classes in their home for many years.

Eisenhower was a star football player at Abilene High School. He had to repeat his freshman year because of a debilitating injury, but he persevered and graduated in 1909.

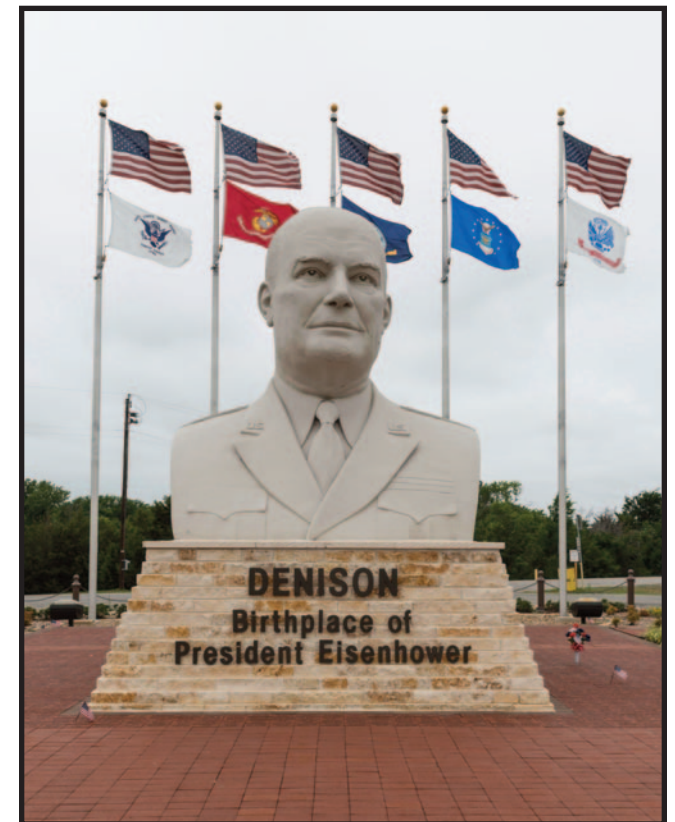
In 1911, he won an appointment to the U. S. Military Academy at West Point. Eisenhower considered it a practical way to get a free education. His mother, however, was disappointed at his choice for a military life, but she did not stand in his way. He graduated in 1915 in a class in which 59 graduates would eventually become generals.

Eisenhower would have a long career of service to the nation. He rose to become Allied Supreme Commander in World War

II, helping to secure the Allied victory against the Nazis. After World War II, he became the first Supreme Commander of NATO.

In 1952, he became the first native-born Texan elected president, widely supported by state residents. Many schools, parks, and streets across the state are named for him today.

Today, his birthplace is a state historic landmark in Denison, marking the beginning of what became an extraordinary life.



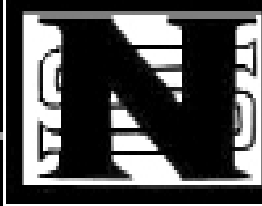
**Dwight D. Eisenhower** was a man who rose to great heights, but he was always a man of modesty. Like so many figures who excelled in America, his rise to prominence was far from certain, but a background of faith, hard work, and education pushed the odds in his favor. Though his time in Texas was short, his impact on the world was profound.

He was born on Oct. 14, 1890, in Denison. His given name was David Dwight Eisenhower, after his father. However, the name was later switched to Dwight David Eisenhower, reportedly to avoid confusion over having two Davids in the family. Reports conflict whether it was his idea or his mother’s insistence.

He was the third of seven boys. His father, David Eisenhower, had attended Lane University to study engineering and had later opened a general store in the tiny farming community of Hope, Kansas. However, the business failed within three years because of the financial crises crippling farmers at the time, forcing the Eisenhowers to move. In 1889, his father found work in Denison as an engine wiper for the Cotton Belt Railroad for \$10 per week.

The growing family scraped by, but faith and education were a must in the Eisenhower household. The future president’s
