National Vietnam War Veterans Day Observed at NASJRB

The Army and Air Force Exchange Service and the Defense Commissary Agency at the Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base (NASJRB) partnered with the United States of America Vietnam War Commemoration to thank and honor Vietnam Veterans and their families for their service and sacrifice on behalf of our Nation.

Following in the footsteps of commemorations honoring military service in WWII and Korea, this multi-year event, instituted by the United States Government under the auspices of the Department of Defense aims to thank and honor the 6.6 million living Vietnam veterans and the families of all 9 million who served on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces from No. 1, 1955 to May 15, 1975, regardless of location.

President Joe Biden was quoted for this occasion, saying, "Every service member of the Vietnam generation should know that their sacrifices mattered and that their serv-

ice made a difference. To the families, caregivers and survivors of the more than 58,000 service members whose names are memorialized in black granite, we pledge to never forget the eternal sacrifice of your loved ones and what you have sacrificed for the Nation. To all the families of over 1,500 service members who remain missing and unaccounted for, know that our Nation's efforts to bring them home will never stop."

An overwhelming attendance of veterans and those who served during the Vietnam era received a Commemorative pin from Gabe Dobson, Executive Officer United States Navy.

Those that participated received gift bags from the BX and Commissary personnel, tables were set up with brochures, various pins, books, poppies and informative reading material provided by American Legion Post 297, VFW Post 10429 and VFW Post 8235. The Daughters of the American Revolution also joined in the festivities.

TRWD's Spring Trash Bash Litter Cleanup April 22

The Tarrant Regional Water District (TRWD) will host two litter cleanups on April 22 aimed at removing trash and debris from the Trinity River in Fort Worth, as well as Marine Creek Lake in northwest Tarrant County.

The Trinity River Spring Trash Bash, held between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m., will feature nine cleanup locations along the Clear and West Forks of the river throughout Fort Worth. Prior to the event, volunteers will be provided trash bags and gloves in order to safely collect the trash.

Participants can pick up trash throughout the morning, and then attend the Trash Bash Volunteer After-Party located at Coyote Drive-In located at 223 NE Fourth Street, Fort Worth 76164.

The Marine Creek Trash Bash will also be held from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. on April 22, and will have two suggested pickup locations: Marine Creek Trailhead and Ten Mile Bridge Trailhead. Participants at Marine Creek Lake will also be provided gloves

and trash bags, and be treated to an after-party at Marine Creek Trailhead from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Cougar Soccer Boys Advance to Regional Semifinals; Lady Bobcats Fall in Regional Quarterfinals

The Western Hills boys soccer team made it a clean sweep last week in the area and regional quarterfinal rounds to advance to the regional semifinals for the first time in nearly 40 years.

Western Hills defeated Life Waxahachie last Tuesday and followed that up with a victory over district foe Carter-Riverside on Friday.

Coach Matt Collins said his team looked sharp in both matches. “Both games were very similar,” Collins said. “I expected close matches. But in both games, we just played really well.”

Collins said he had very strong performances from one player in particular.

“Yeshua Muhindo has really been a standout for us,” Collins said.

Western Hills is scheduled to play San Elizario at 5:30 p.m. on Friday at Northwest ISD Stadium in Justin, and Collins said his team will have their hands full.

“San Elizario is an 'every year' state powerhouse,” Collins said. “They are far from us geographically. I have seen them a few times at the Regional Tournament. It is surreal that instead of watching them, we will be playing them. They are very good. It is going to take our very best to compete with them.”

Over at Benbrook, the season came to an end for the Lady Bobcats

soccer team in the regional quarterfinals last week, but not before a victory in the area round against Brownwood.

Coach Luz Castillo said her team had to dig deep to pull out the win. “The team left every ounce of energy on the field,” Castillo said. “The first half we were down 1-0. We tied the game in the second half and really put the pressure on Brownwood. It was a close match that led us to go into overtime. Campbell Cox scored the finishing goal in the first half of overtime. Everyone's adrenaline was flowing as we took the lead and ultimately won the game, becoming Area champions for the third year in a row.”

Castillo said Benbrook had standout performances from our goalie Caydence Johnston and forward Campbell Cox, who scored the two goals in the game.

“We had an amazing season, winning district, bi-district and area champs,” Castillo said. “I am very grateful for the opportunity. It was my first year coming into coaching, and I was blessed to work with an amazing, hardworking, and talented young group of ladies. I am extremely proud of all of their accomplishments and how far we have come as a team.”

Castillo said her team is losing a lot of firepower to graduation, and she will soon begin to evaluate next year's talent.

“We will miss our graduating seniors, who dedicated the last four years to the sport,” Castillo said. “We have a fairly young team and are looking forward to incoming talent.”

Severe Springtime Weather in Texas *by Dr. Ken Bridges*

In springtime, Texans turn watchful eyes to the sky for rising storm clouds or sudden shifts in winds. Though tornadoes have occurred in all 50 states, Texas is part of the notorious “Tornado Alley” where the often-volatile mix of cool, dry air from the Rocky Mountains mixes with the warm, moist air from the Gulf of Mexico most commonly meet on the Great Plains to produce the violent storms.

Tornadoes have been observed in Texas for centuries. In fact, “tornado” is a Spanish word originating from the early Spanish explorers who saw the deadly twisting winds on the early frontier. Though they have been observed as long as people have trod on Texas soil, one of the earliest recorded tornado deaths in Texas was from an April 1885 outbreak that killed 60 people in the Waco area. Tornadoes have been reported in every region of the state and have been reported in each of the Lower 48 states.

Tornadoes are powerful, compact storms with swirling winds of up to 300 miles per hour. It is these intense winds in the more powerful tornadoes that produce the more unusual stories of straw being flung into trees intact or cars or even trains being lifted up and carried long distances. Most tornadoes have weak winds and never touch the ground, but they can intensify suddenly and without warning. Some tornadoes can travel over a hundred miles before dissipating. In fact, a 1947 tornado formed in the Panhandle and tore through Oklahoma before dissolving in Kansas, leaving 181 dead in its wake.

Tornadoes can form at any time of day or night, they are most common in the late afternoon. However, tornadoes at night have often been the most terrifying. In the years before weather warnings, radio, or storm sirens, communities had no way of knowing if a violent storm was approaching during the night and no way to prepare. Near midnight on May 30, 1909, the town of Zephyr in Brown County was wrecked by a tornado that left 34 dead.

One of the deadliest was in Goliad in May 1902. A tornado that day left 114 dead and nearly 300 injured. Equally as deadly was the disastrous May 11, 1953, tornado in Waco. The storm, measured at one-third of a mile wide, also claimed 114 lives and left nearly 600 injured as the tornado swept through the city, destroying 600 homes. In April 1927, a tornado in Rocksprings in South Texas destroyed all but 12 buildings in the city and killed 74.

One of the worst in Texas History struck Wichita Falls on the afternoon of April 10, 1979. The tornado formed northeast of Holiday in Archer County and raced to the city. The tornado was more than a mile wide as it wrecked a school and a shopping center in the south side of the city, leaving 42 dead and more than 1,700 injured. More than 3,000 homes were destroyed. What came to be called “Terrible Tuesday” haunted the city for years afterward.

Tornadoes are most common in the span of April through June.

In fact, each May will see an average of 100 tornadoes erupting in the state. If the conditions are right, they can appear any time during the year, from the Gulf Coast to West Texas. A February 1935 tornado hit the East Texas counties of Leon and Houston, leaving 12 dead in its wake. In January 1946, a deadly tornado hit rural Anderson County, leaving 15 dead.

Since the end of World War II, technological advances have steadily improved understanding of how and when tornadoes form. Use of radar combined with observations of wind, humidity, and air pressure associated with storm activity greatly advanced weather forecasting techniques. Looking at the success of Air Force weathermen in issuing a tornado watch in 1948 to save lives, prompted the warning system to be adopted everywhere. By the late 1980s, extensive research into tornadoes and new radar systems prompted the National Weather Service to establish a system of Doppler radar towers to monitor the weather. By the mid-1990s, a network of improved Doppler radar sites had been set up across the nation, carefully scanning each storm and relaying that information to the media, to the public, and to government agencies.

Better computer systems allowed forecasters to scan these storms for rotation that would indicate tornado formation. Meteorologists can now have a warning of up to 15 minutes that one may be forming. Because of these developments, better warning systems, and better storm shelters, fatalities from tornadoes have plummeted since the 1950s. Tornado drills have been regular features in schools across the South for decades.

In spite of our advances in technology and more sophisticated warning systems, we are still at the mercy of nature. With each storm, neighbors would always come together and rebuild, determined not to let disaster be the end. Though tornadoes can appear with little warning, careful attention to weather forecasts, preparation, and modern technology can save lives.
