## **Ordinance Amended Regarding Storage and Shipping Containers** *by John English*

The Benbrook city council meeting on Jan. 6 was conducted in person. Mayor Jason Ward called the meeting to order. An invocation was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. An opportunity was allowed for citizen comments with comments being limited to agenda items only, there were none.

The minutes from the council meeting held on Dec. 16 were then approved.

The first and only item on the agenda for the evening was to adopt an ordinance amending Title 8-Health and Safety of the Benbrook Municipal Code (1985) as amended, by establishing Chapter 8.06-Portable Storage and Shipping Containers, regulating the use of portable storage and shipping containers on any residential property, excluding multi-family developments, within the City of Benbrook. Assistant City Manager Jim Hinderaker said it has become an issue in the last several months.

“Over the last year, city staff has fielded a number of residents interested in using storage and shipping containers on their properties,” Hinderaker said. “They typically use them to store and transport household goods for moving or maybe they are remodeling or something like that going on their property...in addition we've had some complaints from residents who have neighbors that are using these containers for an excessive period of time.”

The new ordinance would apply to residential properties (single-family detached and two-family attached homes) and the purpose of the ordinance would be to protect residential neighborhoods from unsightly conditions.

The ordinance would limit the use of such containers to no more than seven days, three times per year; they may only be placed on a driveway or other approved sur- (continued on page 2)

face or private property and may not be placed on public or private streets, sidewalks or other access easement or block visibility of the same.

In addition, the size may not exceed 1,280 square feet by volume (8' wide x 8' high x 20' long) and may not be used as an accessory building, storage building or living unit. It would also not require a permit. The ordinance passed unanimously.

Time was then allowed for informal citizen comments, but there were none.

The meeting was then adjourned.

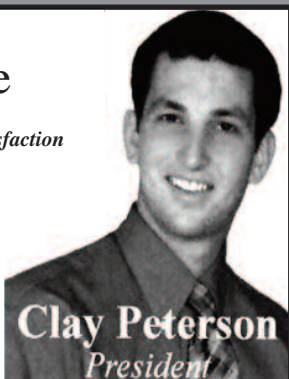

# BMHS and WHHS Boys Pick Up Wins

The Benbrook basketball team picked up a victory on Friday night against Eastern Hills, and coach Blake Mendez said he was pleased with the way his team persevered.

“We came into this game with a very specific game plan defensively and our guys executed it perfectly,” Mendez said. “We couldn’t find a rhythm offensively, but our defense gave us a chance. We hit some big free throws in the fourth quarter that pulled it out for us.”

Mendez said he had a few standout players in the game as well.

“Roderick Hodge and Kemontric Brown were exceptional on defense,” Mendez said. “Those two love the challenge of guarding another teams best players and this game was no different. Hatcher Mason is our spark plug. He never stops crashing the boards and gets us a ton of second chances opportunities. He hit some really tough shots for us as well.”

The Bobcats have Carter-Riverside tomorrow evening, and Mendez said his team should be well-rested for the game.

“I expect us to come in fresh and ready to go,” Mendez said. “We have a bye before we play them and we’re going to use it to get healthy and come out refreshed and ready.”

Over at Western Hills, the Cougars defeated Diamond Hill-Jarvis by a score of 95-41 to improve to 19-3 on the season.

The Cougars were 3-0 in district heading into Tuesday night's game with the Young Men's Leadership Academy, and coach Justin Bryson said he is pleased with the mentality of his team as they open up district competition.

“Coming off the break, we want to get back focused on district play and make a push for a playoff spot,” Bryson said. “We have to take district games one game at a time.”

On the girls side, Benbrook came up short against Eastern Hills on Friday night, and coach Leta Lofton said her team struggled.

“Eastern Hills was very athletic and #12 (Malieya Jackson) was the show,” Lofton

said. “We had a problem containing her. We did not play a well-rounded game and will have to go back to the drawing board to figure things out. We have two of our top players still out. This makes it difficult to adjust but the team is giving effort and working hard to overcome our flaws.”

Benbrook will play Carter-Riverside tomorrow evening and Lofton said that the Lady Eagles would “also be a competitive game for us, but we will go into the game with confidence and a good game plan.”

Over at Western Hills, the Lady Cougars lost to Diamond Hill-Jarvis by a score of 39-26 last Friday.

# Avoid Penalties - Property Tax Deadline Jan. 31

The last day to pay 2021 property taxes to avoid penalty and interest is Monday, Jan. 31.

“All eight of the Tarrant County Tax Office locations are open Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. to assist taxpayers with their property tax payments; however, we encourage taxpayers to pay online whenever possible to avoid the crowds and possible COVID exposure,” said Wendy Burgess, Tarrant County Tax Assessor-Collector. “As online systems become heavily used in the last hours of the day, we recommend you start the online process earlier in the month to avoid complications and not waiting until Jan. 31.”

• Property taxes can be paid online at <https://taxonline.tarrantcounty.com/eta/x/webui/ProfileLogin.aspx>.

• Visa, MasterCard, American Express and Discover is accepted for online payments and in person at all branch locations. A convenience fee will be added to debit and credit card payments.

• Online eCheck payments can be made

with no convenience fee.

• Pay-by-phone is available 24/7 at 817-884-1110.

• Payments made by mail are posted according to the USPS postmark date. Ensure that your payment is postmarked by the U.S. Postal Service by Jan. 31 to avoid penalty and interest.

• Online and phone payments must be completed by 11:59 p.m. on Jan. 31. Incomplete and pending payments completed after midnight will be posted accordingly and accrue late fees.

“The Tarrant County Tax Office encourages citizens who cannot pay in full to make partial payments. Partial payments will be applied and only the remaining balance will be subject to penalties rather than the full original amount due.”

“The new site in White Settlement will help with increased testing demand, and provide more convenient access for residents in the area,” said Tarrant County Public Health Director Vinny Taneja.

Appointments are highly recommended to reduce wait times. Those receiving tests

can present the QR code provided upon making an appointment to expedite the testing process.

# Residential Refuse/Recycling, Bulk and Brush Collection

The City of Benbrook contracts with Allied Waste/Republic Services for residential garbage and recycling services. To promote safe, sanitary, and efficient conditions, the City of Benbrook requires by ordinance (Ordinance No. 642) that all residents subscribe to the refuse service provided by Allied.

To report a problem, please contact Allied Waste/Republic Services directly at 817-953-7214.

## Refuse Collection

- Household refuse and recycling is collected once per week on Wednesdays and must be placed at curbside by 7 a.m. Brush and bulk materials placed at curbside on Wednesdays by 7 a.m. will be collected by Allied/Republic within 72 hours (Saturday by 7 a.m.)

- Please contain all refuse in closed plastic bags, whether or not a garbage can is used.

- It is a violation of City Ordinance to place plastic bags on the curb earlier than Tuesday evening at 5 p.m.

## Yellow Bag Collection

Residents may obtain a second garbage collection during the week by purchasing special yellow bags. A roll of 10 yellow bags may be purchased at City Hall located at 911 Winscott Road or at Benbrook Water Authority located at 1121 Mercedes Street for \$5.64. Boxes of 50 yellow bags are available at City Hall for \$27.09. Prices include the cost of the bags as well as the cost of collection.

The yellow bag program allows Benbrook residents to receive twice per week garbage collection without incurring an increase in the monthly Allied rate. Yellow bags should be placed at curbside on Saturday mornings by 7 a.m. and no earlier than Friday evenings at 5 p.m., and are collected on Saturdays.

## Recycling Collection

Residents may obtain a blue recycling bin; limit two per household, at City Hall or at Benbrook Water Authority. There is no charge for the bins or for bin lids. The City recommends that residents mark their names/addresses on the bin with a water-proof marker. The following items may be placed in bins for recycling:

1. Plastics - Number 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 & 7 plastics such as milk jugs, liter bottles, shampoo bottles, etc. No butter tubs or containers with openings as large as the container. No plastic bottles that have contained oil or petroleum by-products.

2. Newspapers, catalogs and magazines are acceptable.

3. Glass - All colors of glass may be recycled. No plate glass, ceramic or mirrors.

4. Metal - All metal food and beverage cans (tin, aluminum, and steel) may be recycled. It is not necessary to remove labels, but please remove lids and food from containers.

5. Cardboard - All cardboard must be broken down to fit the blue bin. Large boxes may be flattened and placed under the bin.

No tissues or wet paper. No contaminated food items. No Styrofoam products.

## Brush and Bulk Collection

- Brush and bulk materials placed at curbside on Wednesdays by 7 a.m. will be collected within 72 hours (Saturday by 7 a.m.)

- If possible, loose brush should not exceed 4 feet in length, 6 inches in diameter, or 100 pounds.

- Large brush and bulk materials are collected with a special brush truck designed to be used for collecting cardboard boxes, furniture, and appliances (50lb. weight limit).

*Note:* Federal laws prohibit the collec-

tion of refrigerator or freezer units unless certification is provided that a certified technician has removed CFC's. (Check yellow pages under "Appliances-Repair & Service" to locate a certified technician.)

- Allied will not pick up construction materials such as sheetrock, tile, roofing, or earthen materials.

- Due to EPA restrictions, Allied will not pick up used tires; batteries; petroleum products; or containers of paint, herbicide, pesticides, or other hazardous chemicals and solvents.

*Note:* Each spring and fall, the City of Benbrook provides a Household Hazardous Waste Collection day in which citizens can drop off hazardous items at a mobile unit at a designated site. Please check the City's website, [www.benbrook-tx.gov](http://www.benbrook-tx.gov) for the next collection day.

Benbrook residents may take household hazardous waste to the Fort Worth Environmental Collection Center, 6400 Bridge Street (817-392-EASY) during their business hours throughout the year (be prepared to present identification as proof of Benbrook residency).
