High School Basketball: Cougars Best Bobcats in District Opener; Lady Bobcats Tackle Castleberry Tournament

The Benbrook and Western Hills boys basketball teams squared off

Western Hills won the game by a score of 72-46, and Benbrook coach Blake Mendez said his team needs to work on putting a whole game together.

"This game was a tale of two halves," Mendez said. "We struggled with two of our starters out and Western Hills did a great job of getting all of their guys involved. You have to guard everyone on the court when you play them, and they got the best of us."

Quinton Marshall led the Cougars in scoring with 19 points, while Jordan Jones added 15 points for Western Hills.

Ma'Javion Washington and Da'Marea Jones- Evans scored 11 points each in the game.

Despite the loss, Mendez said he feels like his team is in a good place mentally as the district schedule gets underway.

"Our guys never lack confidence," Mendez said. "Even with the loss to Western Hills, we are still in good spirits. We know that wasn't our best, and there's still a lot of basketball to be played."

With the non-district scheduled wrapped up, Mendez said his team was able to face some good competition along the way.

"I feel like it prepared us very well," Mendez said. "We had some really tough games, especially in tournaments, that we are going to be able to lean on come district. I tell our kids all the time that you don't get better by blowing teams out. You need to face adversity so you can learn to respond."

Western Hills has improved it's overall record to 17-3 and was ranked No. 26 in the state among 4A programs according to MaxPreps heading this week's games.

On the girl's side, the Lady Cats competed in the Castleberry Tournament this past week, and coach Leta Lofton said it was good experience for her team.

"We used the Castleberry tournament to get back into playing in their district opener last week, and the Cougars emerged victorious. form," Lofton said. "There was good competition that challenged us in fundamentals and conditioning."

> While Benbrook has struggled record-wise in the non-district portion of the season, Lofton said her team has a positive mindset in district competition early on.

> "The non district scheduled definitely prepared us for district competition," Lofton said. "We are now 3-0 in district, and I strongly believe it is because of the tough non district schedule."


