## Athlete Spotlight: Lady Bobcat Avery Glanzer



A powerhouse in the sport of girl's golf this past spring was also routinely one of the younger players on the course.

Benbrook MHS freshman **Avery Glanzer** reached the state tournament this past season where she finished 11th overall, and coach Joseph Hicks said he could not have asked for more from his young golfer.

"Avery's performance this year exceeded my expectations," Hicks said. "I heard when she was in seventh grade she was good, but not this polished for a freshman. She consistently broke 80 this year and her average score was 76. She made the all-regional team by shooting a pair of 77's."

And Glanzer failed to disappoint at state, also, as Hicks described her performance as "incredible" in the tournament.

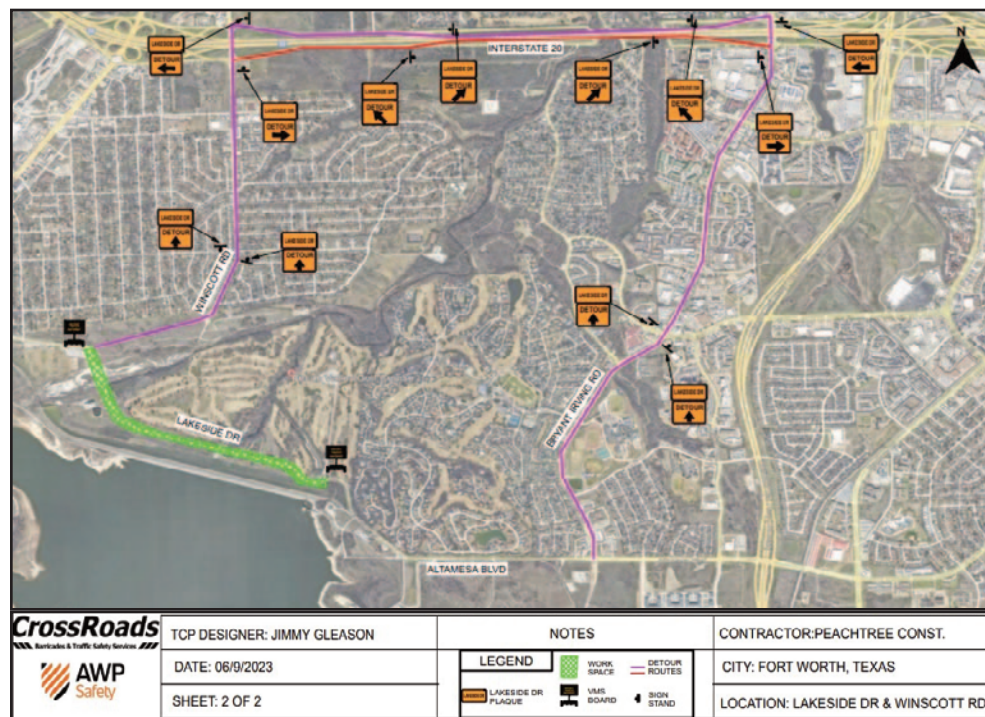
"She only missed the top ten by one shot and only finished nine shots out to win it all," Hicks said. "The more she gets familiar with the course, the better she will do in the future at state. I know she's hungry for a better showing next year."

Glanzer, 15, said she was pleased with her overall performance this past season and said the state tournament was a bit of a mixed bag for her.

"I was extremely excited to compete at the state level and loved every second of it," Glanzer said. "I definitely had my fair share of nerves leading up to the round, but once I teed off on the first day it was all gone. The first day was a bit of a battle, and I ended up shooting 80, but I cleaned some things (continued on page 2)

up the second day and shot 77. Overall, I was pleased with the way I finished, but equally felt like I left a lot out there, and I'm excited to do better next year.”

Glanzer said she was proud of herself to get there.

“It means a lot to qualify as a freshman, knowing I potentially have three more years to try and improve,” Glanzer said. “Gaining this experience at a younger age only means that I can go up from where I'm at now. Ultimately, I just feel super grateful for this opportunity.”

Glanzer, who also sings in the school choir, said one of her biggest challenges at the moment has nothing to do with the physical aspects of the sport.

“I’m always working to improve different aspects of my game and have lately been challenged mentally, with trying to stay in the moment and not be focused on anything except the very next shot,” Glanzer said. “I find myself constantly getting caught up in the bad shots, and so I have been working to keep a neutral and focused mindset during the round.”

For next season, the incoming sophomore has a couple of objectives.

“My goals for next season are to keep improving my short game and continue to drop my scores,” Glanzer said. “I would love to finish higher at the state tournament this year so I am excited to put in work.”

Hicks said Glanzer has been a great addition to the Bobcats golf team

“Avery brings a different attitude for the Benbrook golf program,” Hicks said. “She has upped the expectations for the boys and

girls. Her fellow teammates know what it takes to be successful and are now taking golf more serious by putting in the work.”

He added that it will be quite a luxury to have Glanzer as a part of the program for the next three years.

“I’m very excited for the future of Benbrook golf,” Hicks said. “Avery has the opportunity to make it to the state tournament the next three years. However, she wants to bring the team as many times as possible.”

# Professional Golfer, Byron Nelson

Texan **Byron Nelson** was a legend in sports.

In the 1940s, he was the most successful golfer in the world, never losing his faith or his modesty.

John Byron Nelson, Jr., was born in Waxahachie in 1912 to a hard-working family of devoted churchgoers.

In the 1920s, the family moved to Fort Worth, where Nelson soon found work as a golf caddy at Glen Garden Country Club. He fell in love with golf, even playing in the dark of night. Here he met Ben Hogan, also a young caddy and also one of the future legends of the game.

Nelson turned professional in 1932 and took a number of jobs across the country running several golf clubs as head professional. His first tournament win was the 1935 New Jersey State Open. In 1937, he won The Masters Tournament, his first major championship win.

He had 21 professional wins before World War II erupted. While many other athletes served in the war, Nelson’s hemophilia prevented him from serving. Nevertheless, he continued to play on the PGA Tour and worked to raise money for the war effort. He defeated his old friend Ben Hogan in a dramatic playoff in the 1942 Masters Tournament. The war caused most professional athletics to shut down for 1943, but Nelson came roaring back in 1944, winning eight tournaments in the shortened season.

In 1945, Nelson won 11 straight tournaments, thrilling sports fans. The winning streak set a record which has lasted for decades. He won his fifth and last major, the PGA Championship, in 1945. He won a total of 18 tournaments that year. The Associated Press would also name him its Male Athlete of the Year for 1944 and 1945. He went on to win six more tournaments in 1946 and finished in the Top 20 for 113 straight tournaments.

After the 1946 season, Nelson largely retired from golf after having won 64 tournaments. He continued to play in The Masters until 1966 and played on the American team for the Ryder Cup international tournament in 1947. His last tournament win was the 1955 French Open.

After retiring from golf, a move he said he never regretted, he fulfilled his dream of buying his own ranch. He was content to



work on his ranch outside Roanoke for the rest of his life. A humble man of faith, he continued to serve his church regularly, even serving as a janitor for the church on occasion.

Long after his retirement, Nelson remained a beloved figure by golf fans around the world. He helped coach and advise many young players struggling to find success on the PGA Tour and worked as an analyst for televised golf tournaments.

He also worked with children to help them learn golf and develop Nelson’s same love for the game. In 1968, the PGA Tour renamed its Dallas tournament after Nelson.

For years, the Byron Nelson Classic was the only tournament named after a player. He was inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame in 1974. The PGA also gave him its Lifetime Achievement Award in 1997.

## Dell DeHay Law Library

The Law Library was established in 1944 but did not officially open until October 1945. Over the next 30 years, the Law Library's staff and collections grew.

By 1979, it had received acclaim for its services, in large part, due to Dell DeHay, who served as Librarian from 1962 to 1979. That year, the Law Library became the Dell DeHay Law Library of Tarrant County in her honor. Continued growth and expansion led the Law Library to move to its present quarters on the fourth floor of the 1895 Courthouse during the 1983 renovation. The Dell DeHay Law Library of Tarrant County serves the legal research needs of the Tarrant County legal community and the general public. The Law Library is funded by a combination of a portion of court filing fees and user service fees. The Law Library receives direction and guidance from the Tarrant County Commissioners and the County Administrator.

The Law Library is located on the fourth floor of the 1895 Courthouse, in room 420, at 100 W. Weatherford Street, in downtown Fort Worth.

### Parking

The garage entrance is on Calhoun across from the side entrance of the Family Law Center. Be prepared to pay to park. The parking garage accepts all major credit/debit cards.

Parking is also available at parking meters on all four sides of the Courthouse. Most of the meters have a two-hour time limit and are strictly enforced. If you have handicap plates or a placard, parking at the meters is free, but time limits still apply.
