
#### Castleberry High School Announces **Unofficial May 4** Class of 2024 Valedictorian and Salutatorian Election Results



At Monday night's school board meeting, Castleberry High School Principal Ruben Molinar revealed the valedictorian and salutatorian for this year: Evelyn Yvonne Garcia and Kristian Tyler Perez, respectively.

Evelyn Garcia, the valedictorian for the class of 2024, has been a Castleberry Lion for 15 years, attending Joy James Elementary and Castleberry Elementary. Eveyln is the daughter of Maria and Rodrigo Garcia.

Throughout high school, Evelyn has showcased an interest in the arts and athletics, participating in four years of band and three years of visual art, alongside her three-year commitment to cross country and track. Additionally, her involvement in the National Honor Society underscores her commitment to both academic excellence and community service. Evelyn has excelled academically while enrolled in Advanced Placement, University of Texas On-Ramps, and Tarrant County College Dual Credit courses. She has earned a total of 33.5 high school credits and maintained an overall GPA of 5.067. Evelyn will attend the University of Texas at Dallas in the fall and will major in Graphic Design with an emphasis in video game production.



Kristian Perez, the salutatorian for the class of 2024, has been a Castleberry Lion for 13 years, attending A.V. Cato Elementary. Kristian is the son of Amanda Johnson, Stefanie and Anthony Perez.

Throughout high school, Kristian has demonstrated leadership through his involvement in various organizations including the National Honor Society, Student Council, and National Technical Honor Society. His academic journey is marked by his enrollment in Advanced Placement World History - Modern and Computer Science courses, as well as his completion of 27 hours of OnRamps courses through the University of Texas and several dual credit courses at Tarrant County College. With 100 percent of the precincts reporting, the unofficial results from the May 4th General Election for both the City of River Oaks and Castleberry ISD are as follows:

For River Oaks City Council Place 2, Dan Dagel received 4 absentee votes, 48 early votes and 55 Election Day votes for a total of 107 votes. Steve Holland received 13 absentee votes, 113 early votes and 112 Election Day votes for a total of 238 votes.

Steve Holland received 68.99 percent of the votes to Dan Dagel's 31.01 percent.

For River Oaks City Council Place 4, Sherrie Uptmore Dast received 8 absentee votes, 73 early votes and 69 Election Day votes for a total of 150 votes. Yolie Rodriguez received 8 absentee votes, 99 early votes and 98 Election Day votes for a total of 205 votes.

Yolie Rodriguez received 57.75 percent of the votes to Sherrie Uptmore Dast's 42.25 percent.

For Castleberry ISD Board of Education Place 3, Janice Carrell received 24 absentee votes, 153 early votes and 156 Election Day votes for a total of 333 votes. Ariela Martinez received 25 absentee votes, 173 early votes and 171 Election Day votes for a total of 369 votes.

Ariela Martinez received 52.56 percent of the votes to Janice Carrell's 47.44 percent.

For Castleberry ISD Board of Education Place 4, Linda Ramos Aguillon received 38 absentee votes, 241 early votes and 260 Election Day votes for a total of 539 votes.

Also, for Castleberry ISD's Proposition A, voters For Proposition A cast 15 absentee votes, 222 early votes and 203 Election Day votes for a total of 440 votes. Voters Against Proposition A cast 36 absentee votes, 117 early votes and 152 Election Day votes for a total of 305 votes.

## Folklorist, Writer and Newspaper Columnist, J. Frank Dobie



Great storytelling is an honored tradition across the South and the Southwest. Texas, with its long history of engaging characters and adventures, has produced many tales to tell. Perhaps one of the most respected storytellers was writer and professor J. Frank Dobie.

Born James Frank Dobie on Sept. 26, 1888, a love of literature and the open prairie was instilled in him from birth. The family lived on a modest ranch in Live Oak County in South Texas. Dobie was the oldest of six children, and he worked the ranch with his family from a young age. In the evenings, after the day's chores had been completed, his father read to him and the other children from the family Bible while his mother read classic works of literature to them.

In order to finish high school, Dobie moved in with his grandparents in nearby Alice in 1904. After his 1906 graduation, he enrolled at Southwestern University in Georgetown. Armed with an education, life moved quickly for Dobie. After earning his bachelors degree, he began writing for a number of newspapers for a year before accepting a teaching position in 1911. Two years later, he left for Columbia University in New York City to pursue a masters degree in English. He returned to Texas in 1914 and began teaching at the University of Texas.

Dobie enlisted in the army as the United States entered World War I in 1917. After serving in the artillery for two years, he returned to the university in 1919. After his

Dobie also played a role in preventing longhorn cattle from disappearing. He had been part of the university for several years when students chose the longhorn as the mascot in 1917.
