Boys and Girls Track Athletes Advance to Regionals; Lady Bears Softball Playoff Bound; Bears Baseball to Face Wichita Falls Rider

The Brewer girls track and field program had a strong showing at the area meet this past week, finishing fourth overall out of 13 teams.

Coach Kathi Olson said she was impressed with her team's effort. "The girls did a fantastic job," Olson said. "We qualified in 6 events and 11 athletes, a new school record."

The effort last week broke the 2021 record of five events and 10 individuals advancing on the girls side.

Athletes moving on to the regional meet for the girls include the following:

- 4x100m relay - third place Naytailya Bennett, Serena Boyle, Mya Young, Ondreya Smith, A'Nyah Ivory, Patty Aguilar (new PR of 49.62)
- 100m Hurdles - second place Jaedyn Tipton
- 4x200m relay - second place Naytailya Bennett, Serena Boyle, Mya Young, Ondreya Smith, Laniah Gunn-Gonzalez, Kailee Carr (new PR of 1:45.34)
- 1600m - fourth place Ki Rendon (she had new PRs in all three of her races, she got 5th in the 800m and 5th in the 3200m)
- Shot - fourth place Tori Colman
- Discus - third place Tori Colman

Olson said the regional meet will be challenging, but feels that Brewer will be hold its own. (continued on page 7)

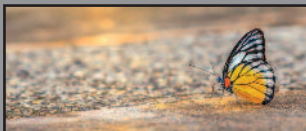

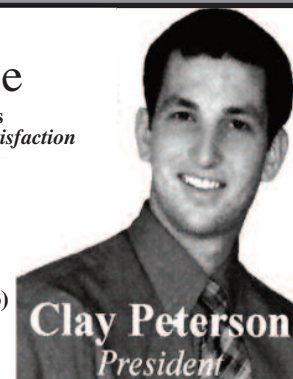

Low Cost Immunization Clinic May 12

White Settlement ISD in collaboration with the Tarrant County Public Health Department will offer a low cost immunization clinic on Thursday, May 12 from 4 to 6:30 p.m. in the West Elementary Cafeteria located at 8901 White Settlement Rd.

The cost is \$8 per shot for students ages 4 and up. Payments may be made in cash (correct change), check made out to TCPH or by Medicaid/CHIP.

A parent/guardian must be present to complete paperwork and bring all immunization records.

The Texas Department of Health requires all students to have all required immunizations prior to start of school. Updated records must be provided to the school nurse in August.

Mobile COVID-19 Vaccination Clinic Friday

Tarrant County Public Health (TCPH) will set up a mobile COVID-19 vaccination clinic in the Municipal Complex parking lot located at 8213 White Settlement Rd. on Friday, April 29 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

TCPH will be offering Pfizer, Moderna, and the J&J vaccines and booster shots.

While Moderna and J&J are only available to those 18+, the Pfizer vaccine is available to everyone ages 5+.

Please be advised that any minors (ages 5-17) must have a parent or guardian present to receive the vaccine. The parent must also present their ID, as well as documentation with proof of the child's age (i.e., birth certificate, shot record, passport, etc.) If you have any questions, call Tarrant County Public Health at 817-248-6299.

Tips for Feeding Ducks

Before you head off to your local pond, here are a few things to keep in mind:

DON'T: Feed ducks bread or junk food. Foods like bread and crackers have no nutritional value to ducks and can cause malnutrition and painful deformities if consumed too much.

DO: Feed ducks cracked corn, oats, birdseed, frozen peas, chopped lettuce, or sliced grapes. These foods are similar to natural foods ducks will forage for on their own.

DON'T: Leave uneaten food lying around. Leftover food in the water can rot and cause deadly algae blooms that affect local wildlife.

DO: Clean up after yourself. Make sure to dispose of all trash, including plastic wrappers, twist ties, and uneaten food.

DON'T: Try to pet wild ducks. They may not appreciate your efforts!

DO: Keep a respectful distance and remain nonthreatening, especially to ducklings who may become stressed or injured more easily.

Texas and the Ratification of the 25th Amendment *by Dr. Ken Bridges*

In the aftermath of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy in 1963, the nation soon asked questions about the presidency. Questions arose about what would have happened if Kennedy had somehow survived but with a severe brain injury or surviving only on life support systems beginning to become available at the time. Vice-President Lyndon Johnson had now become president, and he discussed these concerns with aides and members of Congress. The result was a new amendment to the Constitution.

Including the murder of Kennedy, eight presidents had died in office. Seven vice-presidents had died in office, and one had resigned up to 1964. In spite of these circumstances, the Constitution never made clear what would happen if the presidency became vacant, simply stating that the vice-president would assume the duties of the president, not necessarily becoming president. And the vice-presidency itself would remain vacant until a new one was elected.

Other scenarios prompted questions as to what would happen if a president were somehow physically incapacitated or mentally or psychologically unable to serve. When President Woodrow Wilson had a massive stroke in 1919, he was initially left mostly paralyzed and almost completely uncommunicative for days before he began to recover. Even the most modest medical techniques to treat stroke patients were still decades away. Vice-President Thomas Marshall refused to assume the duties of the presidency while Wilson convalesced, fearing the dangerous precedent it could set as the Constitution provided no guidance for such a situation. Wilson never fully recovered.

Sometimes the vice-presidents themselves posed special problems. Vice-President Aaron Burr killed former Treasury Secretary Alexander Hamilton in an 1804 duel and faced murder charges in New York and New Jersey. Vice-Presidents Daniel Tompkins and Andrew Johnson were both alcoholics. Johnson appeared at his own inauguration as vice-

president in 1865 completely drunk.

President Dwight Eisenhower suffered a major heart attack in 1956 that left him incapacitated for several weeks. The tensions of the Cold War only emphasized the need for president being able to make difficult decisions without delay.

When Johnson delivered his State of the Union Address in January 1964, the image was striking: the next two men in line to the presidency were Senate President pro tem Carl Hayden, the 86-year-old veteran Arizona Senator, and House Speaker John McCormack of Massachusetts, age 72. There was no vice-president sitting behind him as the position had been vacant since Johnson, who himself had a heart attack years before, became president two months earlier.

Sen. Birch Bayh of Indiana and Rep. Emmanuel Celler of New York introduced an amendment in 1965. What became the 25th Amendment enshrined into the Constitution that the vice-president would become the president in power and name if the presidency was vacated. The vice-presidency would be filled by a nomination made by the president and approved by a majority vote of both houses of Congress. The president can voluntarily sign over his duties temporarily to the vice-president as acting president in a letter to Congress.

However, the vice-president and a majority of the presidential cabinet (now numbering 15) inform Congress that the president cannot perform his duties, and the vice-president immediately becomes acting president. However, if a dispute ever arose between the president and his cabinet over his disability, the president can report to Congress that no disability exists and remain president. If the cabinet persists, then Congress settles the matter and must vote within 21 days whether the president is fit.

The House passed the final version by a voice vote on June 30. On July 6, the Senate voted to approve it. The vote was split among Texas's two U. S. Senators. Democrat Ralph Yarbrough voted in favor

of it, while Republican John Tower was one of only five to vote against it. The issue hit especially close to Yarbrough since he had been in the same motorcade with Kennedy on that day in 1963.

Nevada became the 38th state to ratify the amendment on February 10, 1967. Forty-seven states would ratify it. In spite of the support of the state's political heavy-hitters supporting the amendment, Texas was one of the last states to ratify the amendment. Because of the state's biennial legislative sessions, the state legislature was out of session when Congress passed the amendment in the summer of 1965 and throughout 1966. Because of its position on the legislative calendar for the 1967 session, it was not ratified until April 25, becoming the next-to-last state to ratify it.

Within the next few decades, the amendment would be invoked on several occasions. Vice-President Spiro Agnew resigned in 1973 following a conviction on income tax evasion charges. President Richard Nixon selected Congressman Gerald Ford to be the new vice-president. Nixon was forced to resign in 1974 in the wake of the Watergate scandal, making Ford the new president. Ford then chose former New York Governor Nelson Rockefeller as his vice-president, which was quickly approved by Congress. When President Ronald Reagan underwent surgery in 1985, Vice-President George Bush became acting president while Reagan was under anesthesia.

Questions, however, still persist about how the amendment should be utilized, especially if presidents should fall prey to illness that very gradually robbed them of their reasoning abilities or a mental illness.

“Our region is very competitive,” Olson said. “I am confident in my athletes and the work they have put in this season. We hope to make it to the finals in our events and run on Saturday. That's our first goal and then go for that state spots.”

On the boys side, Terrence Durham advanced to region in the 300 meter hurdles with a time of 42.41 and Kameron Sinclaire took third place in the men's triple jump with a mark of 43-9 to advance.

Ka'Morreun Pimpton also qualified for region in the men's shot put with a second-place throw of 51-7.75 and men's discus with a throw of 156-4, good enough for third place.

In softball, the Bears are playoff bound once again, opening a best of three series this evening at 7 p.m. with Richland at Richland High School.

Game two will be played tomorrow night at 7 p.m. and game three, if necessary, will be played on Saturday at a to be determined neutral site at 7 p.m.

In baseball, Brewer raged against the dying of the light after dropping game one of a two game series against Azle last week to keep playoff hopes alive.

The Bears rallied with a 3-2 victory in game two against the Hornets, and coach Gilbert Ramirez said it could not have been more dramatic.

“We were down 0-2 with one out in the 7th when Isaiah Hernandez got us going with a single, and then Jayden Ayala-Hinojosa hit a 2-run homerun to tie the game and send it to extra innings,” Ramirez said. “Evan Laredo ended the game with a walk off home run in the bottom of the 8th.”

Brewer had strong pitching performances by Jayden Ayala-Hinojosa (5 innings, 2 runs, 7 strikeouts), Jeremy Johnson (1 inning, 0 runs) and Andrew Morales (2 innings, 2 strikeouts and 0 runs).

Brewer followed that up with a 6-2 victory over Northwest on Saturday, described by Ramirez as “another well-played game by our guys. I love the competitive spirit and confidence that we are playing with.”

Brewer plays its season finale with Wichita Falls Rider this week, and the stakes are high.

“I expect much of the same this week,” Ramirez said on Saturday. “Another hard fought series against Rider for a spot in the playoffs. We are sitting in a tie for fourth at 4-4 with two games left.”
